As part of the movement to transform scholarly publishing, the Partnership brings together libraries and journals to build a sustainable open access environment in Canada.


What we mean by "Partnership"

Objective

Supporting Canadian scholarly journals in the transition to open access, without APCs

Approach

Close and transparent collaboration between libraries and journals



Partnership in Action

- CRKN and Érudit are aligned on our vision for OA in Canada
- The POA has been a successful and celebrated model of providing sustainable support to journals as they transition toward OA
- The POA is built on close and transparent collaboration between libraries and journals
- The active and intentional ongoing development of the POA, which recognizes a rapidly shifting environment and context, will ensure we continue to deliver on our shared objectives and work towards our vision
- 8+ years into the partnership, we are excited for what is next!

Goals of the POA

- → To create an innovative and collaborative national scholarly publishing ecosystem, based on APC-free open access and on the principles of open science.
- → To build a sustainable
 Canadian scientific heritage accessible to all.

- → To support the international impact of Canadian SSH publications through direct funding of open access publishing.
- → To increase research perspectives in SSH by constituting a comprehensive corpus of Canadian journals, available for data mining.

Partnerships

Partnership for Open Access

- → Agreement between Érudit and CRKN to directly support Canadian journals, since 2014
- → Also an OA business model to internationalize support for Canadian journals (currently includes Couperin and BICfB)

Coalition Publica (<u>www.coalition-publi.ca</u>)

→ A partnership between Érudit and PKP, since 2017



CRKN Licensing & Negotiation Principles

- → We are committed to a robust, sustainable, scholarly communication system that is at the heart of teaching, learning, and research activities, for the advancement of science, scholarship, bibliodiversity, and society in general.
- → We are committed to working collaboratively, at the national and international level, to actively transform the scholarly and scientific communication system toward open scholarship, open science, and open access.
- → We are committed to supporting sustainable agreements that emerge from a diverse scholarly publishing landscape that allows for Canadian not-for-profit publishers to compete and thrive.

CRKN Assessment Guidelines for OA Publishers

- Provider does not charge, or provides a discount on Article Processing Charges (APCs)
- ✔ Non-profit
- ✓ Ethical editorial practices and research integrity
- ✔ Researcher/academy-led
- ✔ Mission-driven
- Based in Canada
- ✓ Platform is interoperable, discoverable, and usable


Open Access at Érudit

Brief history

- → 1998 to 2006: no moving wall
- → 2006 to 2015: 24-month moving wall
- \rightarrow 2015 to present: 12-month moving wall

Collaborations with journals, libraries and funders for a more open, diverse and equitable scholarly publication ecosystem.

Partnership History



Commercial agreement

- Fee schedule per FTE
- 24-month moving wall
- No financial support for open access journals

What is Diamond OA?


A scholarly publication model in which journals and platforms do not charge fees to either authors or readers **(no APCs)**.

This model is already in use by platforms and publishers that are:


- \rightarrow small- and medium-sized;
- \rightarrow community-driven and academic-led;
- → multilingual, covering many disciplines, thus embodying the concept of bibliodiversity, and
- \rightarrow It is a model that is equitable by nature and design.

III. Impacts of the POA

CRKN members provide critical support to Canadian journals



\$700K for the POA with CRKN in 2021



51 CRKN libraries

204 journals

Objectives of the 2018-2022 Partnership agreement

- → Strengthening of governance of Érudit and Coalition Publica
- → Controlled addition of journals, including English and bilingual journals
- → Supporting journals:
 - Transition to open access, without APCs
 - Compliance with open access standards (CC, DOAJ, etc.)
- → Development of the POA internationally

Strengthening governance

- → CRKN member on Érudit Board of Directors
- → CRKN member + ex officio CRKN staff rep on Coalition Publica
 Stakeholder Advisory Committee
- → Embracing a community-based governance approach



Addition of journals






A pan-Canadian collection



A growing number of APC-free/Diamond OA journals





In 2022, 91 libraries around the world supported the POA including consortia from Canada, France and Belgium


...and growing international readership!

33 million downloads on erudit.org (2021) and 5.6 million unique users per year

Impacts of the POA

- → More journals receiving financial support
- \rightarrow A collection that is:
 - Larger
 - More diverse
 - More open
- → A partnership that provides a measure of stability to journals
- → Progress on OA standards
- → Increase in international audience for Canadian research



Building on our successes, Érudit and CRKN wish to continue to develop the Partnership for Open Access with a 2-year extension agreement for 2023-2024.



Looking Ahead



Why an Extension? A Shifting Policy Context

The recent **adoption of Plan S by the Fonds de recherche du Québec** (FRQ) is an important shift in the open access policy context in which we operate.

The FRQ's bold policy move may have **ripple effects** in the **broader Canadian policy** context. We would benefit from the two years of the extension to see some of these effects come to light.

2025 and beyond: A sustainable, fully OA partnership

- → No embargo / 100% Open Access
- → No APCs
- → A growing partnership benefitting authors and journals
- → Maximum participation from CRKN member institutions
- → Long term commitment

During the Extension - Strategic Priorities

- → Participate in national discussions regarding open access, including with funding agencies (FRQ, SSHRC).
- → Coordinate and increase collaboration amongst stakeholders.

- → Promoting the POA as a sustainable APC-free/Diamond OA model for Canada.
- → Assess data and create evidence about Canadian scholarly communications.

During the Extension - Practical Priorities

- → Continuing to privilege the growth of open access content on Érudit through active recruitment of independent Canadian APC-free/Diamond OA journals
- → Working with all of the FRQ-supported journals to help them comply with Plan S

- → Developing a plan to implement our new revenue distribution model and to lift the 12-month moving wall for scholarly journals
- → Building on recent research about Canada's scholarly journals
 - Cdn authors in Cdn journals
 - Collection growth potential

Let's keep bringing Canadian libraries and journals together to support sustainable open access!
