

What are Transformative Agreements Meant to Accomplish?

"At its most fundamental, a contract is a transformative agreement if it seeks to shift the contracted payment from a library or group of libraries to a publisher away from subscription-based reading and towards open access publishing."



Transformative Agreements as Transitional Tools

- Cost Neutral
 The cost of a TA should be no more than the cost of the 'read-only' subscription.
- <u>Cost Containment</u>
 The agreement needs to be structured in a way that contains costs over the long term.
- <u>Sustainable</u>
 The agreement needs to be sustainable beyond considerations of cost, e.g., administrative overhead.





"Unequivocally rejecting the unsustainable oligopoly"





Transformative Agreements: What does Success Look Like?

- Significant increase in open access articles
- Cost reduction and containment
- Investment in other types of OA support
- Increased collaborations, e.g., with government and funding agencies



Optimism About Transformative Agreements

- Making scholarship open access
 - Promote equitable read access
- Researchers don't encounter APCs for covered journals
 - Lower barrier to publishing
- Leverage buying power for lower publishing costs
- One method among several to support global efforts towards transforming scholarly communication

Concern About Transformative Agreements

- A bigger 'Big Deal'
 - Now locked-in for reading & publishing
 - Financial sustainability is uncertain
- Maintains corporate, for profit, oligopoly
- Upholds colonial knowledge systems
- Pay to publish model
 - Advantages institutions with more resources
 - Exacerbates global inequality




