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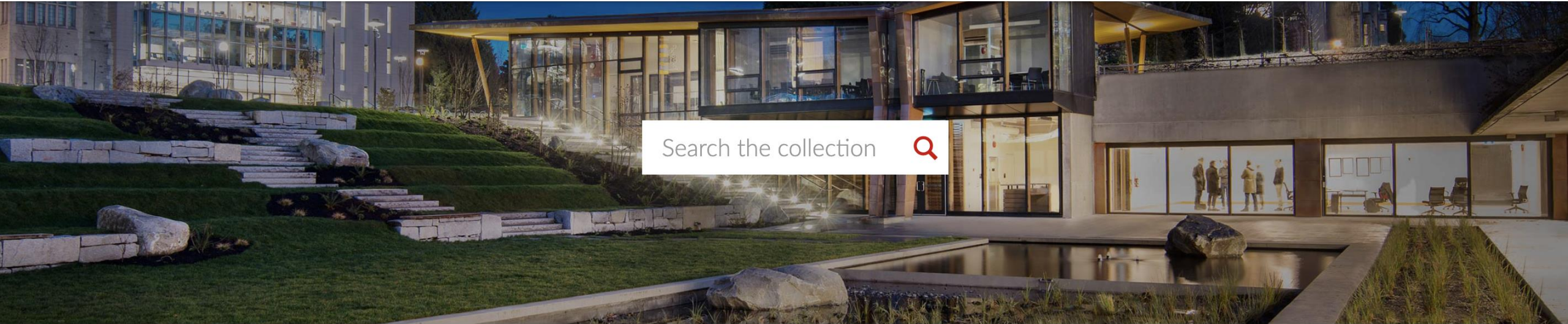

The Indian Residential School History and Dialogue Centre is located on the traditional, ancestral, unceded territory of the hə́ᑲəmiᑎə́ᑎ speaking x^wməθk^wəyəm (Musqueam people).

Welcome to the Indian Residential School History and Dialogue Centre's online collection. This site houses digital copies of public records related to the Indian residential school system and other colonial policies imposed on Indigenous peoples in Canada. The records are brought together from the collections of diverse partner organizations and from individual donors. They include Survivor and Intergenerational Survivor testimonies, events and hearings from the Truth and Reconciliation Commission, photographs, and government and church documents. July 1, 1900 - August 31, 1973

Description

In 1893, the Presbyterian Church built the Alberni Girls Home on Vancouver Island a few miles outside Port Alberni. It was taken over by the United Church in 1925. The school was destroyed by fire in 1917, 1937, and 1941 and rebuilt following each fire. The West Coast Council of Indian Chiefs campaigned for the school's closing in the 1960s, charging that children in need of care were being dumped into the school. The school was eventually closed in 1973. In 1995 a former supervisor at the

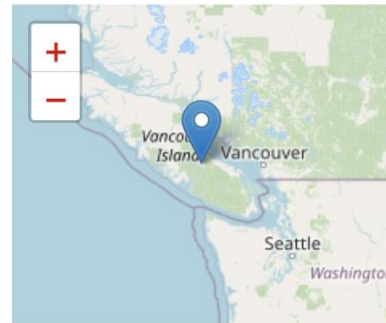

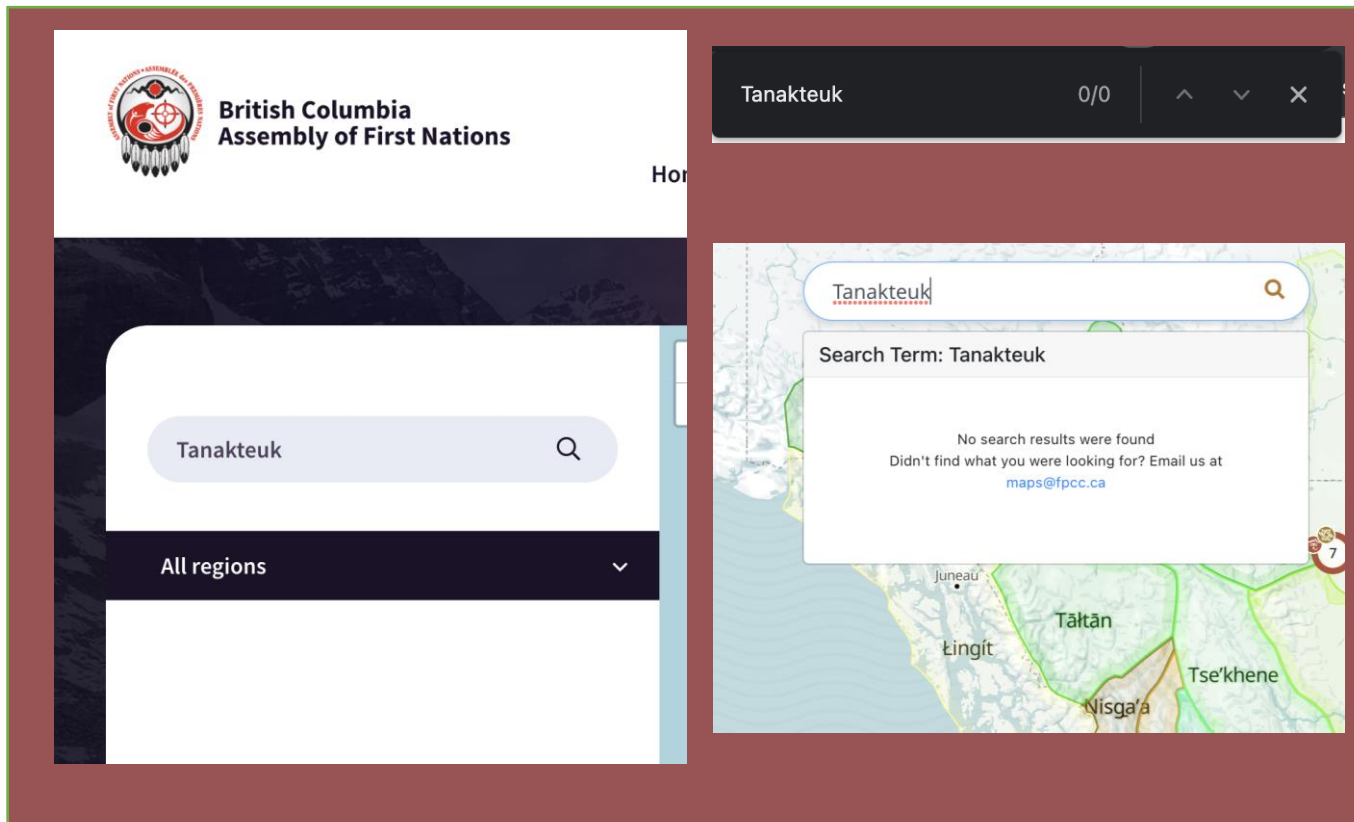

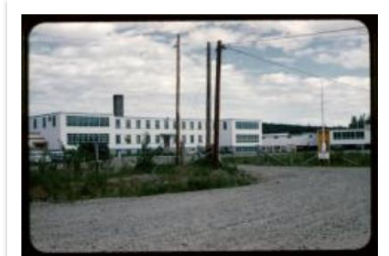

History of Community Name

"Nimpkish is an anglicized form of 'N̓amgis. If you listen to an older person pronounce 'N̓amgis in kwakwala it sounds like Nimpkish. When non-indigenous people started to come to 'N̓amgis lands, they obviously couldn't speak Kwakwala, so they used words as they heard them, such as Nimpkish" (community's website).

Note on Names

Where possible, the community or nation's name in this record reflects the community's preference, as indicated on their website. A list of other names is also provided. These include alternatives used by communities as well as names imposed on communities by colonial authorities. Familiarity with the history and context of imposed names is necessary for finding records about Indigenous individuals, groups and lands in the colonial archive.

Our source for colonial names is government and church documents held by the National Centre for Truth and Reconciliation (NCTR). For alternative names, we have drawn from lists on the websites of the British Columbia Assembly of First Nations (BCAFN), the First People's Cultural Council (FPCC), and the National Indigenous Knowledge and Language Alliance (NIKLA). The source of each name can be found in the hovernote that appears when moving the computer's cursor over a name.

"The Heiltsuk knew the village as 'Qélc, but Europeans recorded various other names for the village, perhaps derived from the local geographical name Pélbála, that eventually gave rise to the modern English name Bella Bella" (community's website).


