
Plan S OA Routes

Self-Archiving

Cost: Free for researchers **Version:** Accepted-Manuscript **Where:** Repository

Fully OA Journals

Cost: Gold OA typically has APCs for researchers; Diamond does not. **Version:** final version **Where:** Publisher's platform



Transformative

subscription journal with a "transformative agreement" **Cost:** get tucked **Version:** final version **Where:** mostly hybrid journals platform




FRQ-funded articles 2020-2022

Used multiple data sources to confirm OA status, self-archiving policy, TA etc.




RQ1: Available publishing options FRQ 2019 vs 2022

OA options under FRQ 2019 and 2022 policy




RQ2: Effect of TAs on publishing options for researchers





- Far from being adopted by researchers






